

Die in order to live – Romans 6:1-14

Share: Have you ever had a bad habit that you have given up? Was this easy or hard?

To remind ourselves, from the book so far, are the people that Paul is writing to believers in Jesus or unbelievers?

Read Romans 6:1-14

How does the question that Paul asks in v.1 flow on from ch.5?

What does it mean to die to sin? (v.2)

How is our “old self ...crucified with him”? (v.6)
(Gal 2:20)

What does being united with Christ in his death assure us of in vv.8-10?

How is the person who has trusted Jesus under grace and not under law?
(V.14)

How would you summarise what Paul is saying being united to Christ means for the way that we see ourselves in relation to God?

Imagine someone asked you, “What does it really mean to be a Christian, and how do you become one?” From Romans 6:1-14, how would you answer the question?

Is living a godly life a passive or active thing according to vv.12-14?

Do you feel that you offer your whole self to God as an instrument of righteousness?
(2 Cor 5: 4-5)

What motivation has Romans 6:1-14 given you to do this?

Spend some time praying for those areas of your life where you are finding it hard to give your whole self to God, whether in thought or action.
